REFLECTION



Gospel Summary Jesus' birth is foretold in this gospel where Gabriel comes to Mary and announces that within her she has the king that Israel has long awaited. To have found favour with God surprises Mary, a woman with none of the qualities valued in her society. She was female, young, poor, and didn't even have a husband or child to give her existence credibility. Not only did this puzzle her, but she knew she was a virgin and carrying a child didn't logically fit. Her puzzlement gave Gabriel the opportunity to explain that the baby she carried was conceived through the Holy Spirit. Mary accepted what was told to her, and remained open to God's will. At the same time, she learned that her cousin, Elizabeth, was also pregnant. This pregnancy was miraculous as well, since Elizabeth had been thought to be barren and was now an old woman.

My Dear Friends:

It is hard to believe that Christmas is almost here. For weeks now, we have been hearing Christmas music on the radio and in the shops. The latter have been all decorated for the occasion. This week, of course, marks one of the times, in the course of a year, in which we become aware that our Christian perspective differs from that of the secular world.

For the secular world, Christmas ends with the Boxing Day Sales. For Christians, our Christmas celebration begins on December 25th and lasts for 12 days, ending with the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6th.

Remember the old English Carol: "On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me....."? There are twelve days of very peculiar gifts. Have you ever wondered about them.

The Carol was created during the English Reformation, when it was illegal to be a Catholic. In order to teach the Faith to their Children, the Catholic created this carol as a means of reminding their Children and themselves of the basics of the Faith. At the same time, however, the secular Authority would not see anything "papist" about the lyrics.

On the 1st day, there is the "Partridge in a pear tree". This is a reminder of Jesus Christ, who died on the cross.

On the 2nd day, there are "two turtle Doves": The Old and New Testaments of the Bible.

On the 3rd day, there are "Three French Hens": The 3 Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope and Love.

On the 4th day, there are "Four Calling Birds": The 4 Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John).

On the 5th day, there are "Five Gold Rings": The Torah, made up of the first 5 books of the Old Testament (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy).

On the 6th day, there are "Six Geese A-Laying": The six days of creation.

On the 7th day, there are "Seven Swans Aswimming": the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and the fear of the Lord).

On the 8th day, there are "Eight Maids A-milking": The 8 Beatitudes of the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 5.3-10).

On the 9th day, there are "Nine Ladies Dancing": the 9 Fruits of the Holy Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control).

On the 10th day, there are "Ten Lords Aleaping": the Ten Commandments.

On the 11th day, there are "Eleven Pipers Piping": The 11 Faithful Apostles.

And finally, on the 12th day, there are "Twelve Drummers Drumming": the 12 points of doctrine proclaimed in the Apostles' Creed.

May your Christmas celebration extend for the full 12 days and may it be a time of joy and love.
