Today (June 23) is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ At one time, this day was called Corpus Christi, Latin for "the Body of Christ." In the most recent revision of the liturgy, the name for this day is expanded to be a more complete reflection of our Eucharistic theology. In the feeding of the 5,000 Jesus is doing more than feeding hungry people.

In the Bible, meals are seen as much more than a means to satisfy a physical need.

In our age of fast food and eating on the go, families often find that they are not eating meals together at a dinner table. The Hebrew people viewed eating a meal as a way of expressing and strengthening their relationship to one another under God's covenant.

As a family, look back over the past week and recall how many meals were eaten together and how many meals were eaten alone or on the run.

It is no coincidence that meals are often the setting of Jesus' teaching and miracles in the Gospels. Together give thanks for the food that Jesus gives us. Make a commitment to share more in this Eucharistic meal together as a family.
